PS - should we take in the eggs as well? She would like to surrender the babies, and wondering about the other eggs.

I am having issues with the babies. I reached out to harrison to make sure no issues with the food batch and none reported.

They sent a message to Bianca Murphy just to check her opinion.

Beakless babies not growing, not really. Crops inflating with gas some. I added in recovery today to juvenile harrison and now both super bad. Before no obv yeast overgrowth. No obv bacteria overgrowth or infection. Initially more beakless one had had a little gas all the time. Since adding recovery worse. Now a little budding yeast in feces and a little bacteria in crop. However more beakless one has crop blow up in minutes - swallowing air. Abnormal. But biggest issue is they are not growing / eyes still closed / featherless.

Going to give extra vit A / B complex / Calcium.

Had already started probiotic. Treated a few times with apple cider vinegar. Now starting fluconazole and TMS. The beakier one still super active. More beakless chirp not as good and jaw seeming to not open as well. Weights are only 12g beakier and 10g beakless. They should be like 50g now. So going to get some other baby bird food and try to switch them over. Captain Jack has been fighting infection, but he only now in the last 4 days developed any pin feathers, after he started eating a bit of zupreem pellets for last week. But his foot infection issues really only cleared up last week as well. Will have Galusha see and give second opinion Monday if you are fine with that. Never had no growth or development like this before. Going to send out a test for PBFD and Polyoma in meantime. And tech just realized they cannot hold their heads up very long. They literally are too heavy for their bodies. They have been maybe the whole time. That is why they always keep wings back and intertwined and try to sleep with head on top of each other. I keep having to separate so the 'bottom' one can breathe easier. (edited)

Possibly. Not a myth. Galusha said either something nutritional / toxin wrong when they were made as eggs, something genetic, something nutritional wrong now. She thinks viral less likely. I switched foods and gave 6 inj of vitamins 2.5 days ago and started vitamin supplement. Of course, last night and this morning they both started to slow down some. Will see when they do. Ideally would send to Dr Bob for histopath if pass, he might be able to give us reason.

I had to let them both go tonight. Have had on oxygen on and off last 2 days, both weak. Crops not emptying and large one bloating with some gas and purplish even on oxygen and with fluids. I am wondering about calcium levels. Some bones seemed fairly stiff but others not as much. Their skulls were still see thru and squishy. Thinking back - the 2 pigeon babies i raised one had similar issues and passed within 2 weeks. The other lived. I had started them on the harrison at first as did not have squab diet which I didnt get until they were about 10-12 days old. Neither grew at first and seemed stagnated and i got them at 12 hrs old. I assumed was cus was 'wrong food' and that the one had gotten crop infection (both did but one moreso then the other). I will see what Dr Bob says about these kids and have food saved for testing if needed. They were trying up til the end. Just too weak and guts not moving.
